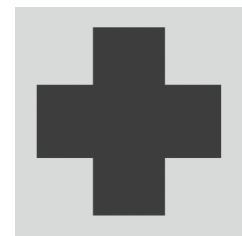
A 20-month project focusing on embedding evidence-based practice in public protection and crime prevention by developing a multi-disciplinary partnership in Merseyside

32 student officer projects including

- Domestic Abuse – What is the police response to low level risk, and how does discretion play a part in domestic abuse and the impact of Zero Tolerance?
- Explore the role of education in the prevention of ‘sexting’ between young people
- Analyse the impact of the Duty to Report requirement for Female Genital Mutilation
- Is the policy of treating crimes against sex workers as hate crimes increasing engagement and reporting?
- Criminal exploitation and youth involvement in gangs
- Police Officers training, understanding, confidence and response to dealing with transphobic incidents
